

DUs Help Big Red Win First-Ever Division Title

After a disappointing 2004 campaign that saw the Cornell baseball team post a 13-29 overall record, a 7-13 Ivy League record, and a winless spring trip—in which the team was outscored 81-14—the team was counted out early for the Ivy League title.

Despite the loss of many key seniors, the young 2005 team won a three-game series in convincing fashion against Big East powerhouse West Virginia in its opening weekend. The struggles began, however, after a ninerun fourth inning in the fifth game of the spring

trip against Illinois sent the squad into a downward spiral, which saw the team losing 11 of the next 13 games—including a four-game Ivy League sweep by Harvard and Dartmouth. The Red then took three of four from Columbia, and a midweek split with Brown saw the team back in Ivy League contention. After a four-game sweep of Penn the next weekend, in

which the Red outscored the Quakers 27-4, the squad was in sole possession of first place. After splitting with Princeton the final

> weekend of regular season play, the Cornell baseball team claimed its first-ever division title and the first by a non-Princeton Tiger team since division play began in 1996.

The Red fell to a talented Harvard team in the Ivy League championship series in early May, but the team was thrilled by the success of the 2005 season. Delta Upsilon brothers Jim Hyland '07 and Blake Hamilton '07 played vital roles in the season's success, which saw five members earn All-Ivy status. Jim Hyland '07, an All-Ivy honorable mention selection as a relief pitcher, went 3-0 with a save and threw eight strikeouts in six appearances to go along with a 2.25 ERA. He also hit .200 with three doubles and eight runs batted in.

Blake Hamilton, an Ivy League weekend starting pitcher, appeared in nine games, starting five, and compiled a 4.67 ERA and a team-best 9.51 strikeouts per nine innings with 37 Ks in 35 innings. With the loss of only five seniors and 11 new incoming freshmen and transfers, the 2006 squad will look to improve on last year's division-winning performance.


