campaign that will be launched this coming September. Between now and then, we'll develop campaign materials and organize the solicitation effort.

We have 1,101 living alumni brothers according to our updated DU directory. We will aim to obtain the highest level of participation ever achieved in a Cornell fraternity campaign. If we do, we should reach our \$1.3 million goal.





Brothers Remain Committed To Philanthropy

This past spring, DU once again had an excellent record for philanthropy, hosting three events. The university minimum is one event per semester, so conducting three is in itself quite an accomplishment.

For Cards and Cookies, we teamed up with the sisters of Kappa Alpha Theta to make Valentine's Day cards and cookies for the Oak Hill Manor Retirement Home. More than 30 brothers and 25 Theta sisters made over 90 cards and 130 cookies, many more than last year. The care manager at Oak Hill said she had never seen such efforts taken by the Greek community.

Our new members carried on the tradition of throwing their own philanthropy project—the annual Valentine's Day flower sale. All 16 new members participated and sold over 600 roses and carnations, raising \$900—\$100 more than last year—for the Ithaca Family and Children's Services of Ithaca.
