More Improvements and Planning at 6 South Ave.

In 2014, Cornell completed what turned out to be a year-long project to remove the fire escape ladders from the outside of the house. This required modifications to the third-floor porch railing and the addition of a new fire-rated door with electronic hold-open in the main stairwell. Safety of the brothers is job one for Cornell and the alumni. The reason the improvements took so long was because Cornell made similar changes at all university-owned fraternities and sororities. The costs at DU alone were in excess of \$50,000. These were effectively paid for by the brothers' room rents, a portion of which goes into facility reserves dedicated to DU.

This past September, the alumni procured several new oak chairs for the DU dining room. These are heavy-duty (of course!), Amish-made chairs, which were purchased through an Ithaca furniture store. Later in the fall, we completed installation of new window coverings in the basement. The fire authorities rejected the plywood coverings built by the brothers in years

past. Accordingly, we hired an architect and an engineering firm to craft new window coverings using hefty, fire-rated materials. Along with the safety enhancements, we also improved the thermal insulation in the basement.

The DU capital improvement planning team, consisting of alumni and undergraduates, met again in February 2015. Preliminary cost estimates of our original plans well-exceeded expectations. The purpose of the meeting was to prioritize and stage capital improvements over longer time periods. Construction times for completion, not to mention alumni fundraising, will necessarily take longer than had been hoped. So it goes when dealing with a 100-year-old fraternity house owned by the university. Next steps include meeting with the powers-that-

be at Cornell to be clear on mutual goals and project requirements.
